2017 Hunter Award Recipient- Bev Long How I got involved in Child Care and why I still care...

I became involved in children's ministry back in 1978 with my local church. Through that experience I gained insight in the needs of children in our community. Then in 1981, I had my first child. I was working full time with the Emporia Police Department

and therefore, had to choose child care for my son when I returned to work. The Child Care Resource and Referral network was not in our area at the time, so I followed ads in the local newspaper and talked to other parents to try and find child care. My provider was accused of child abuse. Upon arriving at the child care home, the provider had 15 children in her care on top of the child that had been taken to the hospital and my son who thankfully slept through the event. That started my concern and advocacy in what quality child care would look like. I was fortunate to have a good friend who also was impacted by this situation and she chose to stay home and care for our two sons for the next three years. This experience was always in the back of my mind.

In 1987, I chose to go back to school, and while I was not certain what I wanted to do, I knew that I wanted to impact the community and help children. Through my time at ESU, I also became a foster parent, caring for a niece, a great nephew, and 18 other foster children. My passion for children grew, and I began working on a Bachelor of Integrated Studies with an emphasis on Sociology and Early Childhood. This led me to working for the University through a grant received from Kansas Association of Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies. It became my passion because of my early experience with child care that went so wrong.

I worked 10 years with KACCRRA, helping child care providers through technical assistance, early childhood professional development, business management techniques, and helping them to fill their child care facility with children through the referral process. I developed lifelong friendships as well as mutual respect for the child care providers who participated in my program and strived for professionalism and quality of care. I also helped to start the Early Childhood Task Force in the Emporia/Lyon County area as well as begin efforts to recognize the National Week of the Young Child that has turned into the Month of the Young Child in Emporia.

When my grant came to an end and KACCRRA went through reorganization, I was devastated. It felt I was losing my "baby" that I started with the Early Childhood Department and the Early Childhood Care Community. But, I was wrong, because through those friendships and partnerships, I found myself in another career that also promoted child wellbeing and quality childhood environments. I now work in the child abuse prevention arena through Kansas Children's Service League. I supervise the Healthy Families program and the child abuse prevention efforts in our community. Through this I have been able to maintain my connection with many of the child care providers and can offer professional development classes such as Mandated Reporter, Adverse Childhood Experience Impact, Darkness to Light as well as other classes that have been approved by KDHE for inservice hours for child care providers and foster parents.

I have also networked with many of the child care providers on community needs, such as diaper drives for the needy and other events such as the Teddy Bear Clinic and the Month of the Young Child.

I feel that all I have done in the community is be present and available, to advocate and support families and children, and that is not just a job or a career, it is a passion and ministry, and I am blessed.
